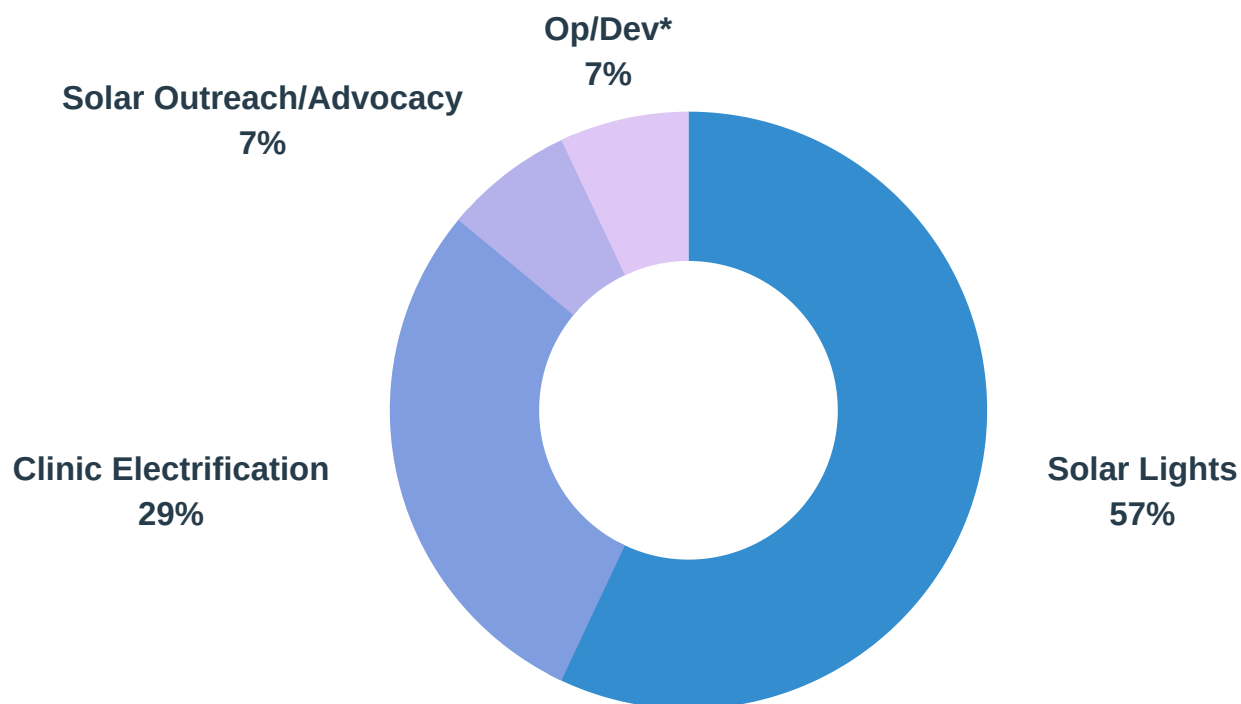

In **2014**, LTBLI began in Sarah and Ben's living room with a handful of volunteers, one African partner, and a budget of \$15,000.

Today, **five years later**, we have grown to include a multidisciplinary Board of Directors, **8** core African partners, and a budget of **\$158,000**.

Still operating as an all-volunteer organization in the US, we employ **3** highly skilled Energy Poverty Consultants in Uganda and trained **25** Field Officers in Uganda, Malawi, and Kenya. Through our Women SET (Solar Empowerment Training), LTBLI also trained **20** Ugandan women to become solar entrepreneurs.

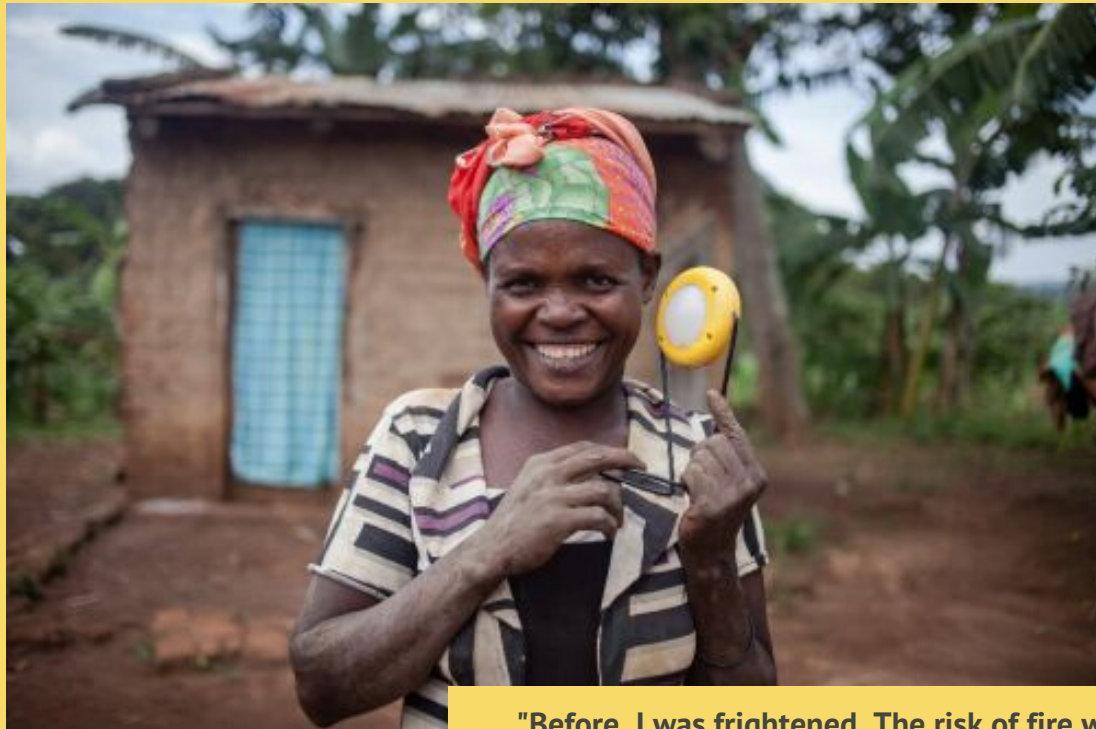
